Dogs Have Their Day at Strut Your Mutt All Breeds Gather Nov. 7 for Doggone Good Time

Every dog has its day, and for many Clark County pets, the annual Strut Your Mutt event is a favorite. Canines and their companions can step out together from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Nov. 7 at Dog Fanciers Park, 5800 E. Flamingo Road near Boulder Highway. This premiere pet event brings all breeds together for a day of activities, contests, booths and performances. Four-legged and two-legged visitors alike will enjoy a splashing performance by Las Vegas DockDogs in its second year at Strut Your Mutt. Admission is \$2.

Strut Your Mutt is known for its contests, and this year is no exception. Dogs and their owners can compete in categories such as KOMP's Bow Wow Ball, Doggie Limbo, Ugliest Dog, Howl at the Moon, Best Belly Scratches, Doggie Musical Chairs, Puppy Love Kisses, the RJ Newspaper Fetch, sponsored by the Las Vegas Review-Journal; and Silly Pet Tricks with and without props. An additional one-time fee of \$2 per dog is charged to those who wish to participate in any of the contests. Registration for contests begins at 10 a.m. with the first contest beginning at 10:30 a.m.

This year's event welcomes back The Las Vegas DockDogs, a nationally sanctioned affiliate of DockDogs Club. DockDogs gives all dogs the chance to be an athlete. Any dog with a favorite throw toy and affection for jumping into a 22,000-gallon pool of water can participate in this performance sport. Similar feats of doggie agility have been featured on "The Late Show with David Letterman." Dock jumping, diving contests and demonstrations will feature Big Air and Extreme Vertical categories. Dogs will compete at 10:30 a.m., 12:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. with the finals and a professional demonstration at 4 p.m. A fee of \$20 will be charged to owners of competing dogs.

Food and beverage vendors and booths featuring Las Vegas animal retailers, organizations and rescue groups will be on hand as well as performers such as Sit Means Sit and others.
